Become more outspoken in defense of the unborn. Many Catholics are under the misconception that last year's Supreme Court decision in the Dobbs case ended abortion. Not in states like NJ. Last year our "Catholic" governor doubled down on his abortion-mania by signing into law The Freedom of Reproductive Choice Act. The new law goes even further than previous laws which already legalized abortion up to the day of birth.

Our council Pro-Life Chair, Jerry Woodring is planning our next prayer rallies across from Planned Parenthood in Newton during the Lenten season. In the past, members of Don Bosco Council, the Columbiettes, as well as other pro-life advocates, have spent an hour a week (or more) in prayerful protests.
