Welcome to Columbian Year 2023-2-24! As we come to the end of the summer, we look forward to the activities planned for the next year. The newly elected officers of the Don Bosco Council are excited to begin our service to the Church, and to the communities we serve at St. Joseph, Good Shepherd, and Our Lady Queen of Peace Parishes.

Our goal is to serve our community in the spirit of service that our founder, Blessed Michael McGivney, established over 140 years ago. We recognize the traditions of the Knights of Columbus and the dedication to our principles of Charity, Unity and Fraternity are more important than ever in our community today. In that spirit, the Don Bosco Council has adopted the slogan: **"Where there is a need, there is a Knight"**. "A need" may be a need at a parish; of a family; of an organization; or, of a community. For example, in the past 3 weeks we have come to the aid of our Brother Knights in Maui, Hawaii in the aftermath of the tragic fires that have destroyed an entire community. We have donated over 6,000 diapers and 10,000 wipes to local community organizations as part of our commitment to the Knights Aid and Support After Pregnancy (ASAP) program.

Upcoming events are:

- September 9 we will hold our Council picnic
- September 19 we will host a Holy Hour Service at Good Shepherd Church
- We will begin our Prayers at Planned Parenthood starting September 28 (every Tuesday, Thursday' and Saturday till November 4)
- October 15 to raise funds to feed the hungry or support a mission, so save the date!.

President's Message

Dear Columbiette Sisters,

Fall is nearly upon us and the majesty of God's creation will soon bring an explosion of bright colors transforming trees and plants into eye-catching beauties. The same can be applied to the Columbiettes as we prepare for a new year of activities full of wondrous enthusiasm to praise God with selfless dedication and work for others. How beautiful is the soul that puts other first.

The 2023 NJ State Columbiette Convention in June brought many awards to our Auxiliary. Through your efforts, we received the Women of God Award, Charity Raffle Award, Retention Award and recognition for Feed the Hungry Program (third place). Once again, this year no certificates were presented but we did receive a can of coffee to serve at meetings for retention and a \$10 Shop-Rite gift card to purchase more food for the 2023-2024 Feed the Hungry Program. Ten auxiliaries reported 32,468 pounds of food donated.

Donations from our Auxiliary included:

- 35 filled backpacks donated (52 last year)
- 35 bags of Toiletries + 13.7 pounds extra supplies which filled two cardboard boxes (2 large Shop-Rite bags last year)
- 59 pounds of can tabs (35 pounds last year)

Our postulant, Sister Jazmin Rangel and our Charity Nominee, Derya Dimirtas each received a \$2,000 check from the State Council Columbiettes and Western Chapter donated \$250 each in honor of Mary Hargraves who recently retired after 32 years of service as Chapter Treasurer. A total of \$28,600 was donated by the State Council during the Convention to various charities.


HAPPY BIRTHDAY, BLESSED MOTHER!
